#### **JANUARY**

#### **Registration Tools**

1. University calendar

#### 3. View your transfer credit report

Before you begin choosing your courses, you'll want to determine what transfer credit you've received from your previous studies. To do so, log in to your Student Centre  $( ..., Y_FY ..., Y)$  and click on the transfer credit report link.

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Are you currently completing winter semester courses at your former institution? If so, these courses won't be included in your transfer credit until they're completed and you've sent o cial transcripts to the admissions team at UCalgary. #### FACULTY ADVISING

Each faculty has program advisors you can speak to about course planning, course selection, registration, program progression and more. #### Webinars

In April and May, we'll be o ering a combination of in-person and virtual workshops/webinars. Keep an eye in your inbox for information on workshop topics and event dates and how to register for them.

#### **Requirements**

The online  $Y_{abs} = \frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{2} = \frac{1}{2}$  (A ) tool allows you to view the pending and completed course requirements for your degree. You can also plan future course selections and explore adding, removing, or entirely changing your degree program components.

To access the AR tool, go to your Student Centre (my.ucalgary.ca). Click on "My Academics" and then select "Academic Requirements." You can also access AR through the Quick Links menu on the myUCalgary dashboard.

You can now begin building potential class schedules using SB. Simply choose the courses that you want to take in the fall and winter terms, and add them to your shopping cart. Remember, at this stage you can only add items to your shopping cart. You can finalize your registration in April/May.

Since registration doesn't happen until April/May, it would be a good idea to write down your required courses and options. That way you'll be able to easily find them when it comes time to choose your courses and build your schedule.

#### **Advising Appointments**

If you still have lingering questions after attending a webinar and reviewing registration tools and resources, your faculty advisors are available to meet one on one to discuss any questions you have regarding registration, course selection, and schedule planning.

Faculty advisors will also be able to review the course schedules you created for yourself to ensure there aren't any issues with the courses you've selected. 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#### TIP!

In April/May, you'll register for both fall and winter courses at the same time. Make sure you explore schedule(s) for both terms so you're ready to register!

Please ensure you initialize your account prior to enrolling for courses. Account initialization becomes available after the schedule is released on March 5 and 42-78 hours after you accept your o er and pay your deposit. **View instructions on how to complete account initialization are available here**.

#### **Understanding your fees**

As a student you're charged tuition and general fees based on your citizenship status, your program of study, the number of courses you're enrolled in and your full-time/part-time status as a student. D, Y  $_{*}$  t,  $Y_{*}$  Y,  $Y_$ 

Mandatory Fees: It's not possible to opt-out of mandatory fees. To see where how the fees are used, request a term account summary in the "My Financials" section of your Student Centre.

Term Account Summary: It is not possible to opt-out of mandatory fees. If you would like to view the impact of these fees, request a term account summary in the "My Financials" section of your Student Centre.

**Optional Fees:** It may be possible to opt out of optional fees such as the health and dental plan or the student donation fee. Details on how to opt out are available  $y_{\text{CN}}$ , however opt outs are typically available by July.

While we wait for fees to calculate on your Student Centre in June, the Term Account Summary can be a helpful tool in the interim which you can use to roughly estimate the cost per semester or per year.
